A Message from Your Pastor

On Thanksgiving Day, we are each invited to consider the blessings we have received from God. As I consider the wide range of experiences many of us have gone through this year, I am drawn to the Apostle Paul's word to the church in Philippi when he writes, "I know what it is to have little, and I know what it is to have plenty. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of having plenty and of being in need." (Philippians 4:12) This verse comes shortly after his inviting others to "not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." (Philippians 4:6)

There are times in life when words of thanksgiving come rather easily. I hope you will give expression to just how thankful you are in such wonderful seasons of life. 
Pill Bottle Recycling

The pill bottle recycling program is well into its second year. So far in 2024, we have mailed OVER 3,600 clean pill bottles to Matthew 25 Ministries (M25). These bottles help the poorest of the poor receive medications in a safe and sterile manner. Bottles that cannot be reused are shredded for cash to aid M25M responses. M25M is responding to both the Helene and Milton hurricanes with shower and laundry facilities as well as airlifting food, clothing, and other supplies. Your clean pill bottles have supported that response. Please remember to clean your bottles – there is typically no way to remove harmful pill residue on site.



A View from the Pew

MEET BARBARA CONAWAY

A member of Ebenezer for 48 years, Barbara Conaway was the church's first secretary, serving three pastors from 1981 to 2000 when the job was very different from what it is today. "There were four pastors counting the exchange pastor from England," she noted. "I typed the bulletin on a typewriter and mimeographed it. I also did the newsletter. In the beginning, I shared an office with Pastor Rick Gray, where there was no air conditioning, and finally got my own office under Dr. Richard Simpson." She also was secretary with Rev. Gayle Annis-Forder.

Barbara has been active in the Women's Retreat, first-grade and young adult Sunday School classes, WOWs, Vacation Bible School, Camp Manidokan, Holly Mart, and missions, including The Heifer Project when it was active. The daughter of Dorothy Tebo, who lives with her now, Barbara has held a variety of other jobs, including bus driver, bank teller, receptionist, giving pony rides for birthdays, and working at Wachter's Auction House. Some jobs were part-time while raising a family. Now retired, her life continues to be very busy. Born to Dorothy and John Dietz in Baltimore, Barbara has spent the bulk of her life in Carroll County. She was married to Charles Conaway, the late Carolene Will's brother, for 36 years, with whom she had three children: Charlie, Kelly and Jennifer. She now also has five grandsons that she helps babysit.

She has lived for 48 years on a 16-acre farm where she and Charles raised race horses and ponies and where she still boards five pleasure horses and keeps her grandson's pony. She loves hiking, walking, the mountains, quilting, reading, puzzles, playing cards, the Orioles and Ravens, genealogy, horses, other animals and family get togethers. From her family research she has learned that her paternal great-grandfather was an original founder and trustee for Mount Olive UMC in Randallstown, and maternal great-grandfather was the founder of First Baptist Church in Monkton, Baltimore County. Further research found that her fourth great-grandfather, William Harvey, fought in the Revolutionary War, making her eligible to join, Daughters of the Revolutionary War (DAR). She even found Harvey's Cecil County farm and a descendant still living there. "That was fun, finding that out," Barbara said.

Also a world traveler, she has a rock collection from every place she has traveled to, which includes Africa, Scotland, Ireland, Spain, Monte Carlo, Italy, France, the Caribbean and Alaska. "Going to Germany and Greece is on my bucket list," she said. Perhaps her most memorable visit was to Africa, where she and daughter Jennifer, a missionary there for four years, started a Young Life group along with other projects. Barbara and her mother also sold crafts to raise money for a well to provide water for the Rwandans. "They had nothing, but were the happiest people in Africa," Barbara recalled. "We went to one worship service that lasted three hours and was the best service." Barbara and Jennifer also led a Bible School for a week in Scotland. Always willing to help others, Barbara and Jennifer have gone to Washington, D.C. for years, once a month, to take clothing and other provisions for the homeless. "I always look forward to serving opportunities and to share the love of Jesus to those around," said Barbara, whose favorite Bible verse is Isaiah 41:10 – "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your

God. I will strengthen you, yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."


