
A Message from Your Pastor

MEET KATHY COSTIN


Kathy Costin is a returnee to Ebenezer after attending in the 1980's during Pastor Rick Gray's tenure. Appropriate, since she graduated from Woodlawn High School with Pastor Rick. After a long hiatus, she came back in 2021. Upon her return, she joined the choir, OWLS, the widows' group, makes crafts for Holly Mart, and helps out at the Community Table at Freedom UMC and our own Food Pantry shed. "I'll do anything that provides food," she joked. She likes to cook and bake and has offered to provide the meal for the April Youth Group meeting.

When she decided to leave Ebenezer at the end of the 1980's it was to be with elderly relatives who attended church at Wards Chapel. Going to church with them gave her the chance to spend time with aunts, uncles and cousins before they passed on. Since then she has started delving into her family's history. "I was a Green and I and [my late husband] Karl are both related to a lot of people here in Carroll County," she said. "We're also related to many that go to church here – it's a big family." Kathy grew up in Woodlawn with Karl Costin. "We were neighbors," she noted. "He was our paper boy." Then he became her husband. "1964 was a rather busy year," she said. "I got engaged to Karl in April, graduated from high school in June, started work in September, and got married in October." Kathy worked for NSA until retiring in 1994, while Karl was a parts manager at a Volkswagen dealership.

In 1971 they moved to Carroll County where she still lives in the same house on Woodbine Road. Two children came along: Bryan in 1971 and Rebecca (Becca) in 1974. In 1995, a week before their 31st anniversary, Kathy, Karl and her mother were on the way to Baugher's for breakfast when they were involved in a car accident. Karl and Kathy's mother died, and she was flown to Shock Trauma with a concussion and other minor injuries. Kathy had also lost her father not long before the accident.

After that, with Bryan and Becca grown, but still home, Kathy needed another income, so worked in IT for ten years at Carroll Community College before retiring for good in 2004. Becca still lives at home and works at Little George's on Liberty Road. Bryan and his wife, Mary Ann live in Westminster. Kathy also took care of her brother, Harvey Wayne, for several years after he suffered a debilitating stroke. Widowed and unable to care for himself, Wayne let Kathy convince him to sell his Frederick home and move in with her. "I rearranged the house and fixed up a room for him and his cat, Angel. When he died a couple of years ago we took his ashes and his cat's ashes and scattered them at Liberty Dam like he wanted," she said.

With more time now for herself. Kathy enjoys doing crafts – she has an embroidery/sewing machine and a cricut cutting machine to help her make earrings and other items. She grows a few flowers, reads and watches Christian books and DVDs, as well as other novels and stories. She has two rescue cats, Toffee and Amaretto, and is thinking about "fostering an older dog with problems and giving it some love." And don't forget the singing. "I've always liked to sing," Kathy said. "I was in the Wards Chapel Choir and in the singing group at Carroll Community College. I had to audition for the college choir, so when I joined the choir here I asked Linda if I had to audition. I haven't been thrown out of the choir yet."






SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM


